

ALCOSAN Open House

On a beautiful sunny September Saturday, the SWEP 3 Rivers Public Service Committee participated in our 5th consecutive ALCOSAN Open House since the chapter started. The ALCOSAN Open House is a Pittsburgh tradition that dates back over 20 years to give the public a sneak peek at how the wastewater plant operates, a glimpse of different engineering and environmental programs going on across the region and provides hands on learning and extra credit opportunities for students.

With the ALCOSAN site under construction the Open House changed things up a little to allow for a compact but exciting event for the community. Our public service committee and board members put together a demonstration of Non-Newtonian fluids, i.e., an **Oobleck-slime** experiment. In this event participants can play with the Oobleck putting pressure on it; punching it, then gently push a finger into it. Oobleck is a suspension, or a substance that can mimic the qualities of a solid or a liquid. These materials are also classified as non-Newtonian fluids. A Newtonian fluid has a constant viscosity, such as water or gasoline. As you might guess, the viscosity of a non-Newtonian liquid changes. Other non-Newtonian examples include silly putty and ketchup!

Composting How-To ft. Pennsylvania Resources Council

On September 13th 2022 SWEP Three Rivers programs committee hosted the first ever composting how-to event featuring Emily Stein from <u>Pennsylvania Resources Council (PRC)</u> at the ALCOSAN customer service and training center. Emily brought a great deal of knowledge around the world of composting and how to better serve your own individual needs when it comes to composting at home. PRC has been facilitating Conservation Workshops since 2000 with over 30,000 participants. These workshops teach the general-public and small non-profit groups the importance of backyard and worm Composting, watershed awareness, rain barrels, green cleaning, and more. SWEP considered PRC the perfect partner to have an intimate limited registration workshop with. We had light refreshments and kept the content educational but very casual. If you are someone who doesn't like huge crowds, loves to learn and have an open forum, this was the workshop to be at.

We were taught what to do with our kitchen, garden, and yard scraps. Emily even incorporated how we could use a beer in the composting process! We found ways to create and utilize natural, home-made compost for our lawns and garden. If you were looking to expand recycling and sustainability efforts to include kitchen scraps and yard debris to turn your yard waste and food scraps into a valuable resource for your garden than this was the workshop for you. This workshop thoroughly covered the importance and benefits of composting, the process, setting up a compost pile, proper maintenance, and ways of using finished compost. Participants had the option to purchase their own EARTH compost bin with attendance. This bin was ideal for urban and suburban areas and has an 82-gallon capacity, a great starter for a novice composter.
